CALL TO ORDER: 7:29 P.M.

President Arndt: The Chair calls to order the North Ridgeville Municipal Council Special meeting dated July 25, 2006. The purpose of this meeting is to review and discuss police travel of more than 500 miles for educational purposes. The Chair confirms for the record that all Council Members are present.

SPECIAL MEETING:

Clerk of Council Norris read the Notice of Special Council for the purpose of approving Police travel of more than 500 miles for educational purposes.

moved by Mayor Gillock, seconded by Olesen to approve Police travel of more than 500 miles for educational purposes

President Arndt: Is there any discussion? Yes, Mr. Mayor?

Mayor Gillock: For the third time this year were confronted with, in my opinion, this ~~arcade~~ *archaic* ordinance that says any time our employees are traveling more than 500 miles, we have to get Council approval. It is not relevant to the dollar amount or anything else. It's just that they're going more than 500 miles. I think when the ordinance was originally written was before the days of corporate credit cards and a lot of other things that we had to reimburse employees. Having said that, this particular application is for two of our policemen, just not two specific policemen but, we have two policemen that wish to attend a conference in Dallas, Texas, August 21 to August 24 which is why we went ahead and had this tonight because it will be before Council convene's again. It is the eighteenth annual crime against children conference sponsored by the Dallas Children's advocacy center. The only thing we have to pay as a City is the registration fee of four hundred dollars. Their travel and their meals are being picked up by the Lorain County Prosecutor. Even though this is a very small amount of money, we still need to have verbal approval for them to attend this conference.

President Arndt: Thank you, Mr. Mayor. Is there any other discussion? Yes, Mr. Boose?

Council Member Boose: Was the 800 dollars approved in the budget, earlier?

Mayor Gillock: Yes, it's in there, not specifically, they have a training budget it comes out of.

President Arndt: Is there any other discussion?

Law Director Crites: If I may, Mr. President? I was almost going to suggest that you refer the matter to a committee but, I think it would be more appropriate that I, following the Mayor's suggestion, look at amending the existing ordinance that addresses this and I will then submit an ordinance, from myself, which automatically gets it referred to a committee. I say that simply to invite any member of Council that has any input on this matter. Please feel free to contact me. I'll be working on it. I have plenty of time since the next meeting isn't until September 5.

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President Arndt: Thank you, Mr. Crites. Is there any other discussion? Just as a reminder, Mayor Gillock made a motion, seconded by Mr. Olesen to approve Police travel of more than 500 miles for educational purposes. All those in favor signify by yes. 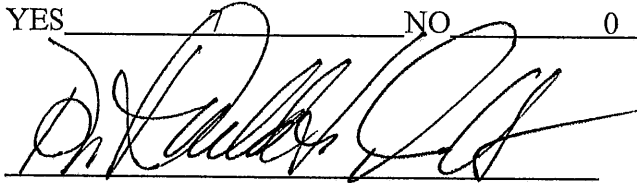

CALL TO ORDER: 7:00 P.M.

President Arndt: The Chair calls to order, one of the first of nine, Special meetings of the North Ridgeville Municipal City Council as requested by our Mayor. We will begin by our Pledge, if you will all rise, please.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: by all

ROLL CALL:

Present were Council Members Nancy Buescher, Dennis Boose, Richard Jaenke, Bob Olesen, Bernadine Butkowski, Gayle Manning and President of Council Ron Arndt.

Also, present were Mayor David Gillock, Safety-Service Director Denny Johnson, Law Director Andrew Crites and Clerk of Council Chuck Norris.

Absent were Engineer Larry Griffith and Auditor Chris Costin.

President Arndt: Couple of comments by the Chair before we begin. First is to thank Mrs. Manning for doing, what sounds like, an exquisite job at our last Council meeting. I've been advised by a couple of my Council Members that, I should, quite frankly, take a seat in the back and simply take lessons from Mrs. Manning, so, I thank you for that. Number two, as I mentioned, we have nine special meetings and the protocol for tonight will be, each meeting will require an opening, an adjournment, an opening of the subsequent meeting, for everyone's clarification. Also, for the record, so that our Clerk does not have to call roll at every meeting. The Chair will confirm for the record that all members of Council are present so, that should save us a little bit of time. Also for the benefit of Council, just as a reminder, Chapter 15.1 of our Charter dictates that passage of each of these individual pieces of legislation will require a two-thirds vote which means a minimum of five votes affirmative. Any questions before we begin with our first special meeting related to T 111? Dr. Norris, will you begin please, with T 111.

Third Reading

President Arndt: Is there any discussion? Mrs. Buescher?

Council Member Buescher: Regarding T 111 and T 112, so that I don't have to repeat this when we go to T 112, eliminating term limits and extending City Council terms are serious considerations for voters which should not be coupled with other issues within the same votes. If the voter loses the ability to vote on one part of the amendment in order to vote for the other

issue contained within the amendment, he is losing his right to vote on every change which has been recommended by the Charter Review Committee. The Charter is the law of the City governed by the people therefore, it is Council's responsibility to see that every single change to the City Charter should stand on it's own when being presented to the electorate. I have no problem with placing all the issues on the ballot, which has been recommended by the committee to Council and, I find no legitimate reason why these amendments involving term limits and terms cannot be presented to the voters as four amendments instead of two. Thank you.

President Arndt: Thank you, Mrs. Buescher. Did I hear a question or a comment?

Council Member Butkowski: Yes, I have one. According to Section 3.12 of the Charter, under procedures, it says no ordinance or resolution shall contain more than one subject matter. This T 111 and T 112 both have two subject matters. The Charter is the rule of the City and we cannot deviate from it for any reason at all. It's in the Charter, it's been in the Charter and we must adhere to it. If someone wants to and we go along and pass these, if they want to they can take us to court on this and hold this up for a long time. I cannot defend the fact that I went against the Charter and will not go against the Charter as it is written. All we have to do is write up two ordinances for 112 and two ordinances for 111 and we will abide by the Charter. Each issue should be strong enough to stand by itself and be voted on by itself and following the Charter. That's all I'm asking that we do and we have plenty of time to take these back and have them written up the way the Charter dictates to us.

President Arndt: Yes, Mrs. Manning?

Council Member Manning: Mr. Crites has gone to seven years of school, three of law school, very grueling and has practiced for many years and I believe that Mr. Crites has ruled on this and I simply abide by his decision.

President Arndt: Thank you, Mrs. Manning. Is there any other discussion?

Council Member Jaenke: Mr. President, I'd like to also comment. This was discussed in the Administrative meeting and also discussed at our Council meeting last week. I have reviewed the Charter and I do not find that we are violating the Charter at all. Our Law Director has done his research and as he reported in the committee meeting and also the Council meeting last week, that we are not violating the Charter. These two items, both the term limits and the four year term for Council is really critical for the City. It takes a long time to get projects under way and I believe that we need and we have a responsibility to give the voters an opportunity, if desired, to elect a Mayor for a third term, fourth term or whatever, as Avon. If you look at Avon, Avon has done a wonderful job with economic development. If you look at Strongsville, good old Mayor Urnfelt who is now passed away, has done a wonderful job but, it takes a long time to get projects completed. The good news we had this week was our credit rating and, what that means is, we may find some major developers, because of the credit rating, wanting to move in our City. That is very powerful and in addition, that takes a long time. We don't do major projects in four years or eight years so, this is critical for the City and certainly support the Law Director in his decision?

President Arndt: Thank you, Mr. Jaenke. Mr. Boose?

Council Member Boose: With all due respect to Councilwoman Buescher and Councilwoman Butkowski, I agree with the Law Director that this is not in violation or a contrast to the Charter.

Three point one two states, no ordinance or resolution shall contain more than one subject matter which subject shall be clearly expressed in its title. That's not just for ordinances or resolutions that change the Charter, that's for any ordinance or resolution. As an example, I have three ordinances or resolutions that were recently passed that were passed by a vote of Council Member Buescher and Council Member Butkowski, that have more than one subject per their terminology. One is ordinance 4233-2006 passed on March 20, unanimously, by Council which talks about the appropriations for money for current expenses. In it there's appropriations for Council, Council Clerk, Mayor, Treasurer and so on. Each one is a line item. If they had a particular issue, any one of those, they can vote for or against because of that. Ordinance number 4293-2006 which is an ordinance accepting certain streets in the Waterbury Subdivision, we're dedicating them for public purposes. In that ordinance, which was passed, seven to zero, there are three specific streets listed, if there would have been an issue with any one of those three, that would vote to their contention and finally, ordinance number 4268-2006, an ordinance amending ordinances 2752-93, 1922-84, 1559-79 and 1275-77 provided for salary changes of Council Members effective January 1. Although Councilwoman Manning and myself did not vote for this, Councilwoman Butkowski and Councilwoman Buescher did. In it are two separate things. One is a two thousand dollar raise from seven thousand to nine thousand and a two percent increase. They are two separate issues as they quantify them per the ordinance. I don't have an issue with, I would much rather myself, as they suggested, two separate ordinances for T 111 addressing both issues but, it was the decision of the Charter Review Committee that this is the way they wanted to have them put in there. The electorate will have the same opportunity as we have. They can decide which of these is more important. If they have a problem with either one, they will vote for or against. I don't have a problem saying that this is going to be difficult but, I do have a problem saying that I am voting against the Charter, going against the Charter and I don't want them to use that quantification for not voting for this. It may be a difficult decision and one that will have to be made by the voter but, it's not against the Charter.

President Arndt: Thank you, Mr. Boose.

Council Member Olesen: Yes, Mr. President, just a few words. I, as a Councilman, look to the authorities we have in this City for guidance on issues. One of those is our Law Director. The others are Engineer, our Building Officer, and if we don't have those people guiding us as to what we can do and what we can't do, I think we're heading for big trouble. What bothers me here is that these are issues of such magnitude and if we have a negative meeting on these issues, I think this might be reflected in the voters towards the Charter amendments and that bothers me. Now, we have decided to be judge and jury on several issues in this City. Special Development Districts is one and now, if you look at Special Development Districts, we have added two businesses in that district. We have three waiting to come in and there was negativism on that as to whether we should have legislation. We have decided that we are the judge and jury on drainage issues which should be handled by our Engineer and that bothers me when we take these issues into task ourselves and we are not the authority on these issues. We have no authority, it's our Law Director and that's why I think we have to go along with it.

President Arndt: Thank you, Mr. Olesen. Mrs. Buescher?

Council Member Buescher: Mr. President, Council is the final authority on all legislation that

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passes in front of us and even when you're talking about special development, there was nothing negative there. That was taken to an outside lawyer. There were a lot of problems with that and that was settled. Unfortunately, City Council does not have its own attorney like other cities have so, when we run into a problem like this, we are listening to the ruling of the Law Director who works at the pleasure of the Mayor. City Council has no one to go to when we have these problems unless we hire an outside attorney. What Mr. Boose has to say, I agree with what he has to say but, as far as legislation that we passed but, this is the City Charter, the law of the people. The people have to have everything presented that was changed on each issue. Mr. Jaenke is talking about the importance of these issues and they are very important. I still can't understand why we don't do them separately. I've talked to a lot of people who look at this and say yes, we're not having the opportunity to vote individually on these issues. There are a lot of people who have a problem with redistricting, they might say, I don't want any change in the redistricting so then, they'll vote against it without even looking at whether or not Council should have four year terms. This is a very serious issue whether Council should have four year terms. The same thing applies with the Mayor's issue where it will be promoted that the first part should be passed so you get the final results in January instead of December, that's one issue and the Mayor, whether his terms are eliminated, is another issue. It seems very clear to me when you're sending this to the people, there's nothing negative about it, it's simply we should have four separate issues, in my opinion. I don't disagree with the Law Director in what he is saying but, I still say that the Charter supercedes everything in the City and should be taken very seriously.

President Arndt: Thank you, Mrs. Buescher. Is there any other discussion? There being none, the Chair calls for the vote. Dr. Norris?
