

**NORTH RIDGEVILLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL
MINUTES OF
REGULAR MEETING MAY 7, 2012**

CALL TO ORDER: 7:30 P.M.

President Kevin Corcoran: I call to order the Monday, May 7, 2012 regular Council meeting. Please rise for the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance.

INVOCATION: led by President Corcoran.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: by all.

ROLL CALL:

Present were Council Members Nancy Buescher, Dennis Boose, Robert Olesen, President Pro-Tem Bernadine Butkowski, Roseanne Johnson and President Kevin Corcoran.

Absent was Council Member Richard Jaenke.

Also, present was Mayor David Gillock, Safety-Service Director Jeffry Armbruster, Law Director Andrew Crites, City Engineer Scott Wangler, Deputy Auditor Teresa Machovina, and Clerk of Council George Smith.

MINUTES - Corrections (if any) and Approval:

President Corcoran: You have before you the minutes of the regular Council meeting held April 16, 2012. Are there any comments, questions or objections to approving those minutes? Seeing none, those minutes are approved.

President Corcoran: Please note the Civil Service Commission minutes of 04.12.12, Board of Zoning and Building Appeals minutes of 04.26.12, Board of Drainage and Flood Control minutes of 02.28.12 and Parks and Recreation Commission minutes of 03.28.12.

LOBBY:

President Corcoran: That brings us to the lobby session. This is your opportunity to address Council if you so choose. You have three minutes per topic. If you would like to address Council this evening, please come to the podium; state your name and address for the record. The lobby session is now open. Is there anybody that would like to address Council this evening?

1) Robert Gaydash: 9400 Avon Belden Road thanked the Mayor and Law Director for their response to his question regarding altering and restricting natural waterways in North Ridgeville, however he believes that his question wasn't answered. He continued to ask for written documentation on how the pipe got under Pitts Blvd. He continued to express his opinion in

regard to that area. He provided an address north of 6010 Jaycox Road and asked what the zoning was on the land. He asked for a second three minutes.

Mayor Gillock: Mr. President.

President Corcoran: Yes, Mr. Mayor?

Mayor Gillock: Mr. Gaydash, you said the first house north of 6010 Jaycox. We will take a look at it. That is all I need to know is the address. On the 42 inch pipe, I don't know how that got in there, that is something we have been looking at. We have an engineering firm that is taking a look at how we can improve that area over there. We have some more work to do, but I agree with you that is a problem over there. We are working on it. There are two 42 inch pipes there and they have been there for a long time, but we are working on that area. We will check out the address on Jaycox and let you know.

President Corcoran: Is there anyone else that would like to address Council this evening? Mr. Gaydash would you like your second chance?

Robert Gaydash stated that what he says here is the truth and if anyone wanted to sue him for speaking the truth, then he would be glad to arrange all the information numerically, alphabetically, color code-wise before he tears it to shreds and throws it back in that trash can in there.

President Corcoran: That brings us to the Administrator's reports. Mr. Mayor?

ADMINISTRATORS REPORTS:

A. Mayor:

Mayor Gillock: Thank you, Mr. President. There are several items to bring to your attention tonight. First, this Saturday, May 12, is our Annual Fishing Derby at South Central Park. The Fishing Derby runs from 8:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. Our Fire Department and the North Ridgeville Fishing Club helps with that. It is open to youths from ages 3 to 18. The Derby is free, but they ask for a \$5.00 donation to aluminum cans for burned children. Bring your own pole and bait. There are a lot of prizes. It is really a good time. They feed the kids, they help them and it is a really good time.

A week later, Saturday, May 19, is Pride Day in the City. It is a citywide clean up. If you want to help in some way, you can call Frank Vacha at the Parks and Recreation Department at 353-0880. If you have a Girl Scout troop that wants to do a flower bed or a baseball team that wants to work out at Shady Drive, we will take all the help we can get. We will be accepting old computers, cell phones, electronic equipment, flat screens and servers; for example, behind the Senior Center from 9:00 A.M. to Noon. Proceeds from the items collected there will benefit Community Care. We will also have the Shred-It truck there from 9:00 A.M. to Noon. That is always really busy. You can bring two banker boxes of documents and have secure disposal of those records. They will

shred them in the truck right there on the spot. That day is also Growers Gardens and Home Tours Day from 9:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. You can call the Visitor's Bureau at 327-3737 for more information.

On June 1, we will have at Lorain County JVS, a North Ridgeville Manufacturing Day. A few weeks ago, I had four different businesses that I ran into and had conversations with that business is picking up and they were having trouble getting welders and entry level plastic injection molding type employees. I contacted the JVS because I know they do have some courses for adults and some training. So, we put together an open house at JVS. North Ridgeville Manufacturers are invited to attend and that runs from 8:30 A.M. to 10:00 A.M. at the JVS. If you are interested in participating, call Tissy Simon at my office at 353-0811. They have a lot to offer employers. This is primarily for manufacturers. They can discuss with you what your needs might be and they might even help set up certain training or hook you up with training they do have and as the economy recovers, employers are looking more and more for trained or semi-trained employees and the JVS can help. They continue to progress and continue to work through those issues and I do not have an exact startup date. It looks good. They have their logos on the tanks, if that means anything. It means something to them. It says Quasar. We just signed today the gas line easements. The waterline is working through the process of getting put in, so the project is continuing in full force, but it did not get open April 30. That concludes my report.

So, we really need to make sure that we get these things done and if we could move this forward this evening and get the engineering done. The total project that was approved at appropriations is \$316,400. Again, it is a very worthwhile cause to get this done. Thank you.

Mayor Gillock: Just from the informational standpoint, this is the huge interceptor that goes all the way to French Creek in Sheffield Village. Inspecting this, which hasn't been done in years, will allow us to locate where it is leaking and where we might have problems and find out what we need to do to get it back in good working condition and hopefully quit spending money on chemicals to treat drain water. So, it is important that we get this done as soon as we can.

Council Member Boose: Also it should be noted that this is about half of the amount that was originally proposed in appropriations. It was originally \$249,000 and so far, the cost looks to be about half that. It doesn't mean that something might be found later, but right now it looks like the city did a nice job at negotiating and working with the company to get the lowest price possible.

Safety-Service Director: Mr. President with regards to the \$122,000, through the due diligence of the community; the city, we actually took what this Council or other Council spent. When we went through the Sheffield Village portion of French Creek and when they were looking at the

CDs, they found that they could use those to analyze so that we're not actually going to refilm those. We are going to do this section. So that is where the reduction in the fee is and based on what we see today and that is until we get out to the manholes that we actually found two years ago, we are hopeful that those manholes are not in any way obstructed by further homeowners that are not in our community, but are in Avon. I am hopeful that the \$122,000 is going to cover that as we go through and there won't be any hiccups in the process.
