

**NORTH RIDGEVILLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL
MINUTES OF
REGULAR MEETING MAY 02, 2011**

CALL TO ORDER: 7:30 P.M.

President Kevin Corcoran: I call to order the May 2, 2011 Council meeting. Please rise for the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance.

INVOCATION: led by President Corcoran.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE: by all.

ROLL CALL:

MINUTES - Corrections (if any) and Approval:

President Corcoran: You have before you the minutes of the regular meeting dated April 18, 2011. Are there any corrections or comments to those minutes? Seeing none, those minutes are approved.

President Corcoran: Please note:

LOBBY:

President Corcoran: We have quickly arrived at the lobby session of the meeting. You are welcome to address Council. If you have anything to add, please join us at the podium. State your name and address for the record. There is also a form you can find in the back of the room that you need to fill out if you are going to do that, so that we have some contact information for you. You are limited to three minutes at a time and the lobby session is open. Is there anybody who would like to address Council this evening? Seeing none, we will move on to Administrator's reports. Mr. Mayor?

ADMINISTRATORS REPORTS:

A. Mayor:

Mayor Gillock: Thank you, Mr. President. I have a couple of things this evening.

Briefly, we continue to address storm water issues. We had a fairly sizable storm Monday evening with a couple inches of rain. We handled it pretty well. We had some incidental issues, nothing widespread. On Tuesday, the City Engineer and some others did walk the Ridgeway Ditch from Maddock Road all the way down Center Ridge; through the back lands and did find three blockages. Two, of which, broke loose during the storm and still need to be pulled out, plus a third one that the property owner cleared. So, there were three major blockages in the Ridgeway that have been cleared out. We have a meeting with representatives from Forest City this week to talk about Waterbury. We continue to take steps addressing that issue.

Secondly, I wanted to mention that we have made some improvements on our City website. We added a section called Publications. Right now, in that section, we have our Permanent Appropriation Worksheet, which is a snapshot of the budget; our Comprehensive Annual Financial Statement, which is a much more detailed report on the City's finances from last year; a copy of the City Charter; a snapshot of our Storm Water Management Plan; the Master Plan, which was on the website, it just wasn't easy to get to, but now you can find it real easy; and a Ward Map. Personally, I am real happy to see these on there and how easily accessible they are. If you, residents, or Council members see something that you think should be on there that is of importance and interest to the City as a whole, let us know and we will see about putting it on there.

A couple other things, just briefly. This is a national magazine that the VFW distributes all over the United States. They are having a voice of democracy contest and Amanda Chow from North Ridgeville was one of the winners who received a 2,000 dollar scholarship and she is to be highly commended. Out of the top 40, she is ranked about 20th, so that is really good for a national contest; whereas a local winner received the rank as high as she did. Congratulations to Amanda Chow.

The last thing I want to mention and the Auditor will speak more to this. You have a resolution before you at your desk that approves advances for various funds, which Auditor Costin will address this evening. Of course, if it is introduced by a Council member or myself, it doesn't have to go to a Committee and I sponsored it.

It was moved by Mayor Gillock and seconded by Buescher to suspend the By-Laws to give this resolution a temporary number and to add this resolution to the agenda under first reading.

President Corcoran: Any questions or comments? All those in favor say yes. Those opposed say no.

Clerk of Council Smith: The temporary number is T 61-2011.

Mayor Gillock: Thank you and that concludes my report.

President Corcoran: Thank you, Mayor Gillock. Mr. Safety-Service Director.

B. Safety-Service Director:

Safety-Service Director Armbruster: To add to the Mayor's report with regard to the major run off of the water, I just want to suggest that along your ditches at your home, a lot of times you stack up your twigs and trees and stuff like that and what we are finding is, and I know it is in your back yard and on your side yard and it is out of sight out of mind, but what happens is, as the flow goes up from these ditches it drags that in and gets caught in the culverts and the underpasses, which creates a problem in stoppages as the Mayor had suggested that we are finding. A lot of this is not new debris that is coming down. It is the debris that has been along these ditches because they are so full of water, that it just can't run. So, please take some time to clean up the sides of the ditches that you have out there. We just don't have the City crew to do it. In total, we are doing the best we can and we certainly are out every day from the Streets Department and those of us in the Administration are out at least once a week policing and looking at ditches to see just exactly where the back up is. So, please be considerate of the ditches as they should be clean and not dirty with twigs and branches. This completes my report.

President Corcoran: Thank you, Mr. Armbruster. Mr. Engineer.

C. Engineer:

Engineer Wangler: Well, since both the Mayor and the Service Director touched on flooding, I think I will limit my report to some news. I just got word that we received Ohio Public Works money for Chestnut Ridge culvert repair and rehabilitation and that is one of the first steps needed to be in place in order to begin redoing that whole road. That concludes my report.

President Corcoran: Thank you, Mr. Wangler. Mr. Auditor.

D. Auditor:

Auditor Costin: Yes, thank you. I have no report scheduled for this evening, but I would like to address the resolution that the Mayor referred to, which I handed out to you before the meeting. As this goes on each year, we have certain federal grant funds that we obtain, primarily the CHIP Grant Housing Funds and those are reimbursement grants, which means we have to spend the money first, turn in the paper work and then we get reimbursed and so, what we do each year is

we approve a resolution to advance or loan monies from the General Fund to the Federal Grant and/or State Grants Fund as applicable. This particular resolution is to advance or loan monies from the General Fund to the Federal Grant Fund. That is all we need at this time. We didn't anticipate the CHIP Grant to start up as early as it did and I would request, if you wouldn't mind, we pass this tonight with the emergency and then we will be able to move on to advancing those monies. When the monies are repaid or when the grant monies are received, later in the year, we will have another resolution to repay the advancement back to the General Fund. That concludes my report and my comments.

President Corcoran: Thank you, Mr. Costin.

E. Other Reports:

President Corcoran: Please note the Police Department Report for March 2011. That brings us to the Council Committee Reports.

COUNCIL COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Clerk of Council Smith:

UTILITIES COMMITTEE REPORT of 04.19.2011 recommended CH2MHILL Sanitary Sewer Rate Study and proposed legislation be prepared for a three (3) percent increase in sewer collection system rates effective June 1, 2011 and an automatic increase of three (3) percent thereafter beginning on February 1, 2012 through February 1, 2016.

It was moved by Butkowski and seconded by Boose to approve the Utilities Committee Report.

President Corcoran: Are there any comments or questions?

Council Member Boose: Yes, Mr. Chairman. I just wanted to let everyone know that of course we did have a Utilities Committee meeting on this particular subject. The City has done many things over the past year to help alleviate the double digit increases that the City has seen during the past couple of years in this sanitary sewer rate and so, we were very pleased to only have a three percent increase effective June 1 this year and also, to recommend that a three percent increase be instituted for the next several years; effective February 1. Of course, those are always subject to review of additional studies. The study, as has been in the past, was very complete and very detailed. It took in a lot of different scenarios as to how much money needs to be spent, where the money needs to go for our infrastructure for our sewer program and again, though no one likes to have any type of increase in their sewer rate, the three percent is much more palatable, than again, the double digits we had last year and the year prior. I want to commend the Administration, the folks out at French Creek and everyone involved for how they were able to put together a nice program last year to make sure that we didn't have to have the adverse affects this year and how they dealt with it in a palatable manner.

President Corcoran: Thank you, Mr. Boose. It was moved by Butkowski and seconded by Boose to accept the Utilities Committee Report. All those in favor say yes. Those opposed say no.

abatement starting last year with less than a full year and so, we are just changing the date in order that it allows the full benefit for the entire ten years. That is all that is. It is just changing the date on the contract.

Mayor Gillock: Mr. President, this is an expenditure of 50,000 dollars to help with the sanitary sewer flow between Elder, Oxford, Ridgeview Boulevard, and Drake Street areas. This is one piece of our efforts to address some of the flooding issues. We are increasing our spending to 200,000 dollars a year. This is a fourth of that right here, but this is something that we need to do to help those residents in that area. So, I would like to get this passed as soon as we could so we can get started on this.

Mayor Gillock: Mr. President, partnering with the City of Avon who has taken the lead on this for us and have applied with NOACA for funds to help us with the renovation of the intersection of State Route 83 and Mills Road. This is basically a statement of support from Council that you are willing to consider this and that you think it's a good idea. We can then send this along with our application to NOACA. It does not commit us to any funds specifically at this time. Thank you.

Council Member Buescher: Mr. President, I have heard many comments from people concerning that intersection and it is an improvement that is much, much needed there and I am glad we are going ahead with this.

Council Member Butkowski: Mr. Chairman. Finally! I've been complaining about this for years and it is a very dangerous intersection; especially for the school buses. I drove a bus through there and held my breath every time I made a left turn out of there, or into there, or where ever I had to go. It is terrible and if they need somebody to speak on this, I can talk for an hour on how terrible that is.

Council Member Boose: Mr. Chairman, not only is it dangerous, but it is also backed up for many, many, many minutes because of the increase in our residential homes and businesses in the area. I travel that every day and depending upon what time of day you go through there, you will sit at that light for several changes before you go through. So, it is much, much needed.

Mayor Gillock: Mr. President, that is exactly the comment I was going to make. Our study actually shows that the level of service, from an accident rate standpoint, is not way out of line. Maybe, because it is dangerous people pay more attention and we don't have as many accidents that you would think, but the delay and the level of service is terrible. You get up there and you can't get through. That is the biggest issue with it. So, Avon and North Ridgeville have been

working on this for some time. Avon did some preliminary engineering, which we helped pay for and this will help greatly to improve this project.

Council Member Butkowski: Mr. Chairman, I was sitting there at that light in a passenger car and saw an accident come through that just missed our car. It ended up in that ditch. I think people are driving safe there because of the big ditches too.

President Corcoran: It was moved and seconded to give T 58 a first reading this evening. All those in favor say yes. Those opposed say no. T 58 will get a first reading. T 59.

This is an abatement to Rhenium Alloys for improvements they will make to the building that I always call the Marconi building on Taylor Woods on the south side; the eastern most building. This is the 60,000 square foot or larger building that has been vacant for several years. Rhenium has purchased that building with the investment of three million dollars. I think they are bringing 50 jobs with them and adding 25 more. That is a significant job increase for North Ridgeville, along with putting this vacant building back into use. Just a reminder that the abatement is only on the improvements and not on the taxes that are already being paid on the building. So this is just a win, win for us all the way around. Some of the gentlemen are here today watching what goes on with this. We are glad to have them here.
