

**NORTH RIDGEVILLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL
MINUTES OF
REGULAR MEETING JANUARY 22, 2013**

CALL TO ORDER: 7:30 P.M.

President Kevin Corcoran: I call to order the Tuesday, January 22, 2013 regular Council meeting. Please rise for the invocation and Pledge of Allegiance.

INVOCATION:

Led by President Corcoran.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:

Led by all.

ROLL CALL:

Present were Council Members Nancy Buescher, Dennis Boose, Richard Jaenke, Robert Olesen, Roseanne Johnson, President Kevin Corcoran and President Pro-Tem Bernadine Butkowski.

Also present was Mayor G. David Gillock, Safety-Service Director Jeffry Armbruster, Law Director Andy Crites, Auditor Chris Costin, and Clerk of Council George E. Smith.

Absent was City Engineer Scott Wangler.

MINUTES - Corrections (if any) and Approval:

President Corcoran: You have before you the minutes of the regular Council meeting held January 7, 2013. Are there any corrections or objections to approving those minutes? Seeing none those minutes are approved.

President Corcoran: Please note the Planning Commission minutes of 01.08.13.

LOBBY:

President Corcoran: That brings us to the lobby session of our meeting. This is your opportunity to address Council, if you choose to. If you are going to, please bring step up to the podium and state your name and address for the record. You have three minutes to speak on the topic of your choice. Is there anybody that would like to address Council this evening? Seeing none, we will move on to the Administrators reports. Mr. Mayor, that would be you.

ADMINISTRATORS REPORTS:

A. Mayor:

Mayor Gillock: Thank you Mr. President. There have been some recent articles in the newspaper regarding Quasar and the lagoon in the Oberlin area. Just for clarification; although there was an error in the first article that came out in the paper, we are not involved in that. We have three contracts with Quasar. One, we lease them property for their operation at French Creek. Secondly, we have a management contract with them to dispose of our sludge and our sludge is not the only sludge that they are dealing with. They deal with sludge from other cities. They deal with organic material from retailers. We simply send our sludge to them and they

treat it and haul it off. Once it leaves French Creek, it is theirs. We have nothing else to do with it. They were hauling some to Lime Lakes. They put it on farmer's fields and apparently they are building a lagoon that we know nothing about. We have no involvement with it. The third contract is the Power Purchase Agreement for the electricity that we buy from them. We have kept purposely, through this whole private/public partnership at arm's length distance from them because it could impact our nonprofit status. We have nothing to do with the lagoon issue that has been in the paper a lot lately.

Secondly, I would like to thank everyone for their kind comments and condolences of the recent passing of my sister. Thank you and that concludes my report.

President Corcoran: Thank you, Mayor. Mr. Safety-Service Director.

B. Safety-Service Director:

Safety-Service Director Armbruster: Tomorrow is a big day for our water purchases. It is the day that we will be changing the ERV to the Elyria Water System and all the capital improvements have been made down on Sugar Ridge and we will be changing that valve so that we can start accepting the water through the Rural Lorain System into ours and reducing the pressure, which means we will be taking water from Elyria. That water that we are getting from Elyria will be \$1.20 a gallon versus Rural Lorain at a \$1.44 at this point. So, it is really a good deal for the City of North Ridgeville. Those of you this morning, that noticed the snow squall that sat above us and in about a matter of an hour and a half to two hours we got buried in about four to five inches of snow. I don't know what the official count is, but the street crews were called out as quickly as we could get them out there. Recognize the crew starts at 7:00 in the morning and to get them there at 6:00 or 5:30 is a four hour call-out. So, we tried to adjust as the snow started at 6:00 and we got them there at 7:00 and got them out on the roads and the roads were probably not as clean as we what would have liked to have them, but noon time, we were down to concrete and we were ahead of it at that point. So, they again did a great job and I think all the cul-de-sacs are completely done at least ours are and they are actually cleaner now then what I have seen in a long time. They must have put somebody else on my street and on my run. That concludes my report.

President Corcoran: Thank you Mr. Armbruster. Mr. Auditor.

Auditor Chris Costin: Thank you, Mr. President. Two items, under the Auditor's report, the financial report was handed out this evening. We were physically unable to meet cloture due to the fact that we didn't have certain information that we needed to file a somewhat accurate report. This is a preliminary report and it is not complete and you need, obviously, take no action on it. But you did receive it in hard copy tonight. I would then like to bring your

attention to under ordinances and resolutions, T 14 through T 19 and remind Council that you need to take no action on these as we will pass these during the meeting that we pass the permanent appropriations. We have this every year and they are in order for the bidding of materials and services and the money is not fully appropriated to allow us to pass these particular ordinances at this time. That concludes my comments and that is T 14 through T 19.

Moved by Mayor Gillock and seconded by Olesen to give T 13 its first reading this evening.

President Corcoran: Any comments or questions?

Mayor Gillock: Mr. President, in our contract with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees, AFSCME, we are in the third year and there is an allowance for a wage reopen. Three years ago, AFSCME employee's wages were frozen and two years ago, they took two weeks furlough with no pay as well as given back half of their longevity payments. Last year, the same thing, except we were able to reinstate one week of furlough. So they still gave up one week of furlough and half of their longevity. So, for three years, the AFSCME employees have helped the city out during our financial challenges and I think it is only fair at this time that we give them the same consideration that we have given the Police Department. What we have negotiated is a \$.75 cent an hour increase, which will benefit, if you look at it on a percentage basis, it helps the lower paid employees more than the higher paid, but this is what we have negotiated and I think it is very fair and we would like to get this passed this evening if we could.

Council Member Boose: Mr. President, can I ask what the range in percentage increase is?

Mayor Gillock: It is about four percent. Which, when you look back over their contract, we are comparing it to the Police and we are really looking at it as two years at two percent each to get them where they need to be. The lower employees will be a higher percentage and the higher employees will be lower and it will be around 4.

Council Member Boose: If I can ask, how does this affect the negotiations with the Fire and Police then? Does that set some sort of precedent that we now are obligated to pay two percent.

Mayor Gillock: We have begun negotiations with the Fire Department and I can't really discuss that openly, but the Police Department took a three year contract with a two percent, two percent, and a wage reopener, so they got their four percent. This is basically on that same four percent increase level. I can't really talk about the Fire Department because we are in the middle of negotiations. Although, I do believe that we may be going to fact finding and I believe that is public information.

President Corcoran: Anybody else?

Mayor Gillock: Mr. President, I would also add that when the Police took the two, two and wage reopener, their insurance contributions also went from 10 to 12 and a half, which is something we wanted. We are trying to keep all three unions on the same level of four percent and they went 12 and a half. We can't discuss that with the AFSCME during a wage reopener. The only thing we can discuss is wages. So, this will get them through and next year they will have a new contract discussion.

Council Member Boose: Mr. President, thank you and I understand. I guess my only comment would be I don't know that we went into their three year agreement, two years ago, with the two weeks furlough and half of their longevity and then last year, one week furlough and half of their longevity understanding that we would make up, so to speak, the two percent that the Police got last year, and this year to give them all four percent. Maybe we did, but I wasn't aware that is what we were going into to make that up.

Mayor Gillock: It is something that we were going to do with AFSCME but we negotiated that Police contract and reached an agreement and historically, the city has always tried to treat the three unions basically the same as far as wages and things like that. This is less than what they asked for but I think it puts them back generally on the same footing as well.

President Corcoran: Mr. Armbruster?

Safety-Service Director Armbruster: In comparison of parity, you take 2009 where we had parity and there weren't any differences, it brings us into parity with where we were in 2009. We did that analysis through the Auditor's office and the Administration. It gets us to,

Councilman Boose, what you are looking for from the standpoint of the parity side of it in where we were in 2009.

Councilman Boose: Thank you.

Mayor Gillock: If Council so desires, we would be willing to meet in executive session and discuss the contracts, but we can't openly discuss current negotiations.

President Corcoran: I think that would be a good idea.

Moved by Johnson and seconded by Buescher to dispense with recess and adjourn into executive session at the recess for the reason of discussing the collective bargaining agreement.

President Corcoran: Any comments or questions about going into executive session? All those in favor say yes. Those opposed say no.
